## Official Opening of The Lisson Grove Centre

Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> March 2013 saw the official opening of the Lisson Grove Centre by the Lord Mayor Cllr Angela Harvey.

The building, which is the main centre for Westminster Adult Education Service, is an existing Westminster City Council property that has been refurbished to provide modern classrooms and support facilities.
